

#### Proposer's Comments:

Because of the gross sizes of some of the areas, it was hard to achieve the smooth definition of the areas to be included in a particular supervisor district. Further, I had done all the work with a list of areas only to find the map divided into more areas than listed in the base materials. I had spent more than four hours waiting on the mapping software for a task that should have taken no more than 45 minutes with access to the ALL the data and suitable mapping software. This mapping tool is a trojan horse of the first magnitude. It appears to be designed to destroy the interest level of the public in participating in the redistricting process.

### **Consultant's Review Comments:**

This plan increases the population deviation four-fold.

This much deviation precludes meaningful assessment of the Voting Rights Act issues.
