

Consultant's Review Comments:

This plan makes a significant reduction in the total population deviation, achieving a deviation of just 0.29 percent.

The slight increase in the voting-age minority proportion in District 2 is a positive change, but the slight loss in District 3 may be a problem, depending on the effectiveness of that district's minority residents in electing candidates of their choosing.
