

Consultant's Review Comments:

The district population equality of this proposed plan is exceptionally close: a total plan deviation of less than one-half of one percent.

The voting-age minority profile is very close to that of the current districts. District 3 gains one percentage point and District 2 loses a point. Small adjustments along the boundary between those two districts would probably give both districts a slight gain in minority proportion.
